MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

December 3, 2020

Dear HBA-NJ familia, supporters, and friends,

¡Buenas noches! It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to the 41st Installation and Swearing-In Ceremony of the Hispanic Bar Association of New Jersey (the "HBA-NJ"). After nearly ten years on the Board, the HBA-NJ truly has become part of my *familia*. And now, I have the distinct honor of leading this great and impactful organization. *¡Adelante vamos!*

My vision for the HBA-NJ is embodied in our annual theme: *¡Respira! Break Barriers & Rebuild Our Future.* This year was, and continues to be, an unprecedented and exhausting year. "*Respira*" – or "Breathe" – is the foundation of our theme, and serves as a stark reminder of the racial injustices we witnessed this year, which are perhaps best represented by the killings of George Floyd in Minnesota and Carlos Lopez in Arizona. We heard terrifying recordings of them pleading for their lives and repeating they could not breathe. The HBA-NJ remembers our fallen brothers and sisters, and we will be there, every time, to condemn injustice.

"Respira" is also a call to action. While we all take aim at helping others, it is important for us to pause for a moment, take a breath, and remember to care for ourselves. The pandemic has magnified one of the most serious problems faced by many lawyers: mental health struggles, including depressions, anxiety, and alcohol and substance abuse. The Latinx community suffers disproportionately from unmet health needs. To break the stigma that attaches to mental health issues in many circles, the HBA-NJ will be hosting its first ever M.E.N.T.E. Conference, which stands for Mental Education & Nurturing Through Engagement. The M.E.N.T.E. Conference will tackle various mental wellness topics, including risk factors associated with burnout, aiming for an appropriate work-life balance, spotting friends and colleagues who may suffer from mental health issues, and how the pandemic may have exacerbated the intensity of stress-related symptoms. We will address multiple coping skills, such as positive thinking, breathwork, gentle stretches, socialization, and exercise, all of which can help combat and prevent mental distress.

The second component of our theme – "Break Barriers & Rebuild Our Future" – sets the stage for an aggressive agenda. Over the last few years, anti-immigrant rhetoric has reached unprecedented and dangerous heights. As the voice of the Latinx legal community in New Jersey, the HBA-NJ will press for change to reverse this rhetoric and to further the rebuilding and healing process. Now more than ever, our voice must be deafening. Together, we can and will make that happen.

The HBA-NJ will be heard on proposed legislation and public policy that impacts our community, meet with government officials to ensure our voices are heard, and demand the promotion of Latinos and Latinas to important positions of influence. We will continue to educate. For example, the New Jersey Supreme Court recently amended the CLE rules and regulations to require courses devoted to diversity, inclusion, and the elimination of bias. That is a remarkable achievement that I hope will create meaningful change in our profession. The HBA will be part of that change. We will focus on the presentation of CLE courses to educate our profession on these important topics. Finally, we will continue investing in our pipeline of Latinx leaders. Our annual Law School Mentorship and American Dream Pipeline Programs are already firing on all cylinders. We will also continue awarding scholarship to promising Latinx students, and growing our Scholarship Endowment Fund.

While I am excited about our future, I must acknowledge the awe-inspiring year we just had under the leadership of Immediate Past President, Melinda Colón Cox. In a pandemic, Melinda raised more than \$100,000 for scholarships and donations, created various programming designed to help our membership during the worst of times, and spoke out and against condemned injustice. Melinda led passionately and fearlessly, and I am honored to have served as her President-elect. Congratulations, Melinda, on a remarkable year!

I also must extend my deepest appreciation to our sponsors. Without them, we would not be able to put together the great programs we hold year after year. I cannot emphasize enough that, even during a pandemic and facing economic uncertainties, our sponsors continued to believe in and support our mission. They are true champions of diversity and inclusion. That matters. They deserve your time, attention, and business.

To our distinguished friends, members, and guests, I thank you for joining and celebrating with us tonight. I hope everyone has a wonderful and fun evening!


She also competed in the Eugene Gressman Moot Court Competition and won second best brief. Lisette worked in the real estate industry as a licensed realtor during law school.






Highlights from 2019-2020 HBA-NJ Events
